MUHAMMADU BUHARI
President Of The Federal
Republic Of Nigeria

President Muhammadu Buhari was born on December 17th 1942 in Daura, Katsina State, to Adamu and Zulaiha Buhari. He attended the Katsina Provincial Secondary School, now Government College, Katsina, from 1956 to 1961, where he earned his West African School Certificate. He joined the Nigerian Army in 1961. He was admitted to the Nigerian Military College, Kaduna. He underwent the cadets training at Mons Officer Cadet School in Aldershot, England from 1962 to 1963, and was commissioned as Second Lieutenant in January, 1963.

As a highly regarded officer, Buhari held several key command and staff as well as political appointments during his illustrious military career. These included Military Secretary; Member, Supreme Military Council; Military Governor of the North Eastern State; Federal Commissioner of Petroleum Resources; Chairman, Nigerian National Petroleum Corporation; General Officer Commanding, 4th Infantry Division and General Officer Commanding, 3rd Armoured Division.

General Muhammadu Buhari became the military Head of State and Commander-in-Chief of the Nigerian Armed Forces in 1983. The major economic and social thrust of his administration centered on reducing expenses of government; promoting industrialization; reducing the balance of payments deficit by cutting imports; prohibition of borrowing by state governments; realignment of import duties; waging a war against corruption; and instilling a culture of discipline by introducing the popular 'War Against Indiscipline' (WAI) program. War Against Indiscipline was one of the most enduring legacies of the 1st Buhari administration.

Launched on March 20th, 1984, the WAI policy sought to address the pervasive lack of public morality and civic responsibility in the Nigerian society.

General Buhari was appointed Executive Chairman of the Petroleum Trust Fund (PTF) by President Sani Abacha in 1994. The main consideration in appointing him to this position was his strict discipline and incorruptibility. The PTF under General Buhari intervened directly in strategic areas: Construction and maintenance of roads; water supply; supply of educational materials and rehabilitation of educational infrastructure; healthcare; food supply; and other projects. The impact of this interventionist agency was felt across the entire nation in its four and a half years of existence.

He unsuccessfully ran for the office of president in the 2003, 2007 and 2011 general elections. In December 2014, he emerged as the presidential candidate of the All Progressives Congress (APC) for the March 2015 general elections. Buhari won the election, defeating the incumbent President Goodluck Jonathan. This marked the first time in the history of Nigeria that an incumbent president lost to an opposition candidate in a general election. He was sworn in on May 29th 2015.

President Muhammadu Buhari has received many honours and commendations, including the title of Grand Commander of the Federal Republic (GCFR), the Commander of the Federal Republic (CFR), the Defence Service Medal (DSM), National Service Medal (NSM), General Service Medal (GSM), Loyal Service and Good Conduct Medal (LSGCM), Forces Service Staff (FSS), The Congo Medal and the Global Seal of Integrity (GSOI). President Buhari has been married to Aisha Halilu since 1989. He has ten children.

“We cannot build an economy where corruption is the working capital. As far as the constitution allows me, I will try to ensure that there is responsible and accountable governance at all levels of government in the country. For I will not have kept my own trust with the Nigerian people if I allow others to abuse theirs under my watch.”

His Excellency Adeyinka Asekun, born on the 11th of June 1956, is a business management professional, a seasoned banking as well as marketing and sales practitioner, and the Nigerian High Commissioner to Canada. He is a graduate of the University of Wisconsin, where he obtained a Bachelor of Business Administration majoring in Marketing. He went on to obtain an MBA from California State University, where he wrote several highly regarded papers dealing with topics in International Business with a focus on marketing.

Asekun began his professional career with S.C. Johnson & Son (U.S.A), a \$2-billion-dollar FMCG multinational company in 1983, where he was responsible for selling, merchandising, field intelligence, implementation of sales and marketing programs at the retail level, developing programs and promotions. He also handled marketing research and product management at the Nigerian subsidiary of SCJ. He has taken up different managerial positions — largely in the financial services sector in Nigeria and abroad since then.

Over time, Asekun has worked at the International Merchant Bank, United Bank of Africa (UBA), and Oceanic Bank PLC, which was acquired by Ecobank Transnational in 2011. Noteworthy among his assignments in these institutions were; Head of the National Sales Force and Head of Retail Credit Products at UBA, Head of Retail Banking at Oceanic Bank, and Acting Managing Director of Oceanic Savings & Loans. While at UBA, he won an award for product innovation for leading a team that developed and launched two highly innovative and successful consumer loan products.

Asekun joined the Board of Directors of Wema Bank PLC in August 2012, serving as the Chairman of the Board Risk Management Committee and a member of the Board Credit Committee. He became Chairman of Wema Bank in December 2012, playing a leading role in the successful turnaround and transformation of the Bank, including returning it to profitability, upgrading it to a National Banking license from a Regional license, and launching Africa's first fully digital Bank (ALAT). He stepped down as Chairman of the Bank in May 2017 to take on a public sector role in transforming the nation.

His Excellency Ambassador Asekun was also, until his recent appointment as the Nigerian High Commissioner to Canada, the Chief Executive officer of Hebron Limited, a full-service training and consulting company based in Lagos, Nigeria, and a Non-Executive Director at e-payment services provider eTranzact International PLC. He is happily married to Mrs. Olawunmi Asekun and they are blessed with four children.



ABOUT NIGERIA

THE HEART OF AFRICA

Popularly known as the heart or the giant of Africa, Nigeria is the most populous country in the continent of Africa, with a population of more than 180 million people. Among one of the biggest democracies in the world, it has a dual economy, based on its rich natural resources and agriculture as well as trade. It not only shows high potential in human resources, but is also endowed with rich natural resources such as oil, gas and minerals.

Nigeria aims to develop other strategic sectors. Boosted by the size of its population and economy, it is a regional powerhouse, now recognized as Africa's largest economy, having edged out South Africa. The country has a rich land and diverse cultural heritage, with more than 250 ethnic groups, a wide array of religions and sophisticated visual arts. The talent, creativity found in its festivals, music, sculptures, literature and films are well known worldwide. The country is divided into 36 states.

CLIMATE

Nigeria has a tropical climate with variable rainy and dry seasons, depending on the location. It is hot and wet most of the year in the southeast, but dry in the southwest and farther inland. A savanna climate, with marked wet and dry seasons, prevails in the north and west, while a steppe climate with little precipitation is found in the far north. Rainfall decreases progressively away from the coast; the far north receives no more than 20 inches (500 mm) a year. On the coast, the mean monthly maximum temperatures are steady throughout the year. The humidity generally is high in the north, but it falls during the harmattan season, which has the hot, dry northeast trade wind. This blows for more than three months in the north, but rarely for more than two weeks along the coast.

CULTURE

The culture of Nigeria is shaped by its many ethnic groups. The country has 527 languages, over 1150 dialects and ethnic groups. The six largest ethnic groups are the Hausa and Fulani in the north, the Igbo in the southeast, and the Yoruba predominate in the southwest, Efik - Ibibio, and Ijaw of the South South. The constitution guarantees religious freedom. Christians predominantly live in the south of the country, whereas Muslims live predominantly in the north. Native religions in which people believe in deities, spirits and ancestral worship are spread throughout the country.

TOURISM

Nigeria has many natural landmarks and wildlife reserves. Protected areas such as Cross River National Park and Yankari National Park have waterfalls, dense rainforests, savanna and rare primate habitats. One of the most recognizable sites is Zuma Rock, a 725 meter-tall monolith outside the capital of Abuja that's pictured on the national currency. Obudu Mountain Resort, formerly known as Obudu Cattle Ranch, is one of the most beautiful and pleasant tourist destinations in Nigeria. The country also boasts of many festivals like the Argungu Fishing Festival, Eyo festival, Calabar Carnival and many others.

UNEARTHING MINING OPPORTUNITIES

Hon. Uchechukwu S. Oguh is the current Nigerian Minister of State for Mines and Steel Development. He is an oil magnate, entrepreneur, investor and philanthropist. Oguh is the President of Master Energy Group a conglomerate with over 15 subsidiaries and interests across a variety of industries. Dr. Uchechukwu Oguh holds the Nigerian national honour, the Officer of the Order of Niger (OON). He was nominated for a ministerial appointment by President Muhammadu Buhari and was later appointed as Minister of State, Mines and Steel Development on Wednesday, August 21, 2019.

Dr. Oguh holds an MBA from University of Lagos and he is a fellow of Institute of Chartered Accountants of Nigeria (ICAN) Fellow, Institute of Brand Management of Nigeria; Fellow, Nigerian Institute of Shipping; Fellow, Employment & Career and member, Chartered Institute of Bankers.

In December 2001, Oguh established Uche Oguh Foundation which aims to promote empowerment, poverty alleviation, and providing education for the less privileged. He had sponsored free medical services in different parts of Nigeria, in addition to building and equipping a number of modern hospitals in his native community, Uturu and other communities in Nigeria. He also partnered with a number of medical centres, including the Hopeville Rehabilitation Centre, to fabricate artificial limbs and calipers for people with disability.

In 2014, Oguh was awarded, a national award - the Officer of the Order of the Niger (OON) by the Federal government of Nigeria[His other awards and honours include:

Dr. Uchechukwu Oguh was nominated for ministerial appointment by President Muhammadu Buhari on July 23, 2019 along with 42 other nominees.[12] During his senatorial screening on July 24, he narrated his plans on how to work on Nigerian refineries[13] as well as his plans for the Nigerian currency rate[14]. Oguh was confirmed for ministerial appointment by the Senate on July 30 [15] and on August 21, 2019 was confirmed and sworn in as the Minister of State for Mines and Steel Development.

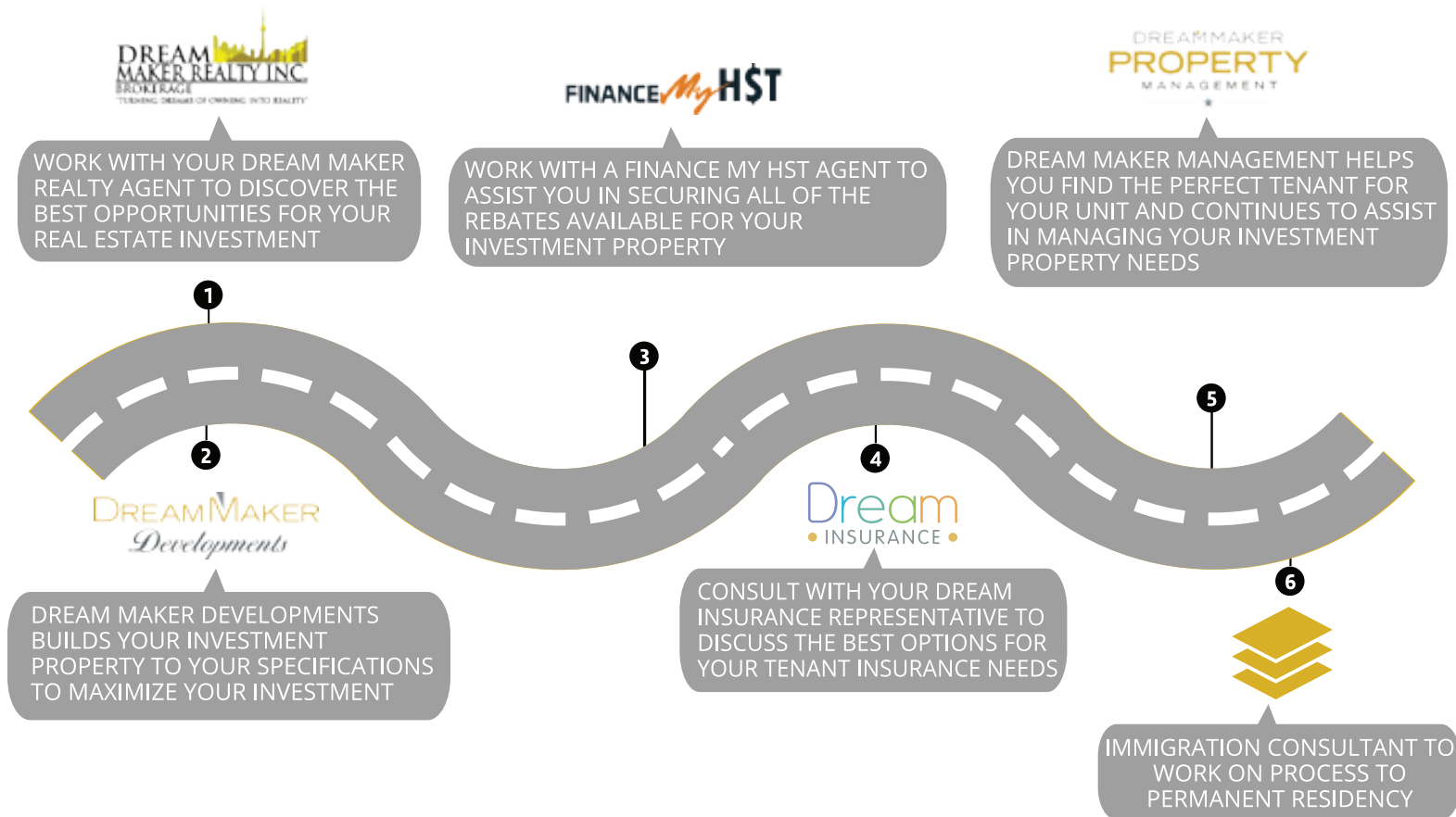
